Karen Denise Metts Blanset, Ph.D., is a heroine.

Hero comes from the Greek: when translated, it means defender or protector. Karen Blanset is both; because, she gave her life protecting and defending the lives of her two grandchildren with great love and indomitable courage. This has been proven to be the infallible truth and the facts are incontrovertible. Her death, while tragic, is a testament to her nobility and character as a mother, daughter, wife, educator, and devoted grandmother.

April 5th, 2019, Friday morning, she awoke to discover there was fire in her home; whereupon, she sent her four-year-old grandson (Sawyer) outside to safety; she followed him outside and once there called her husband who was working in Charleston.

After a very brief conversation with Rick and in haste, she re-entered the home, hoping to find John Michael who was upstairs asleep. Locking the doors behind her to prevent the boy (Sawyer) from following her back into the house, she knew she had to attempt a rescue. With single-minded determination, she knew she must save the life of John Michael. Her abounding faith, love and great courage were the only the tools that she carried into the house.

Smoke filled the room, while more smoke filled the house.

She was discovered later by rescue personnel at the base the stairs; John Michael was discovered upstairs in his bed. According to reports, Neither Karen nor John Michael could be resuscitated at the home.

Many news outlets rushed to report the fire and the casualties of this tragedy, but nothing was ever said about the “true story” of why a grandmother gave her life for her grandchildren.
